FRANKFORT, KY – At its November 13, 2024 meeting, the Executive Branch Ethics Commission found Anthony Page of Lexington, Kentucky, in violation of KRS Chapter 11A, the Executive Branch Code of Ethics.

In a Settlement Agreement approved by the Commission, Anthony Page admitted to one (1) count of violating the Executive Branch Code of Ethics. While employed as a Workforce Development Facilitator, Office of Unemployment Insurance, Page used his position in a manner which involved a substantial conflict between his personal or private interest and his duties in the public interest. Specifically, during April 2021, Anthony Page used a state-issued vehicle for non-state activities. This created privileges and financial gain and was in derogation of the public interest at large.

Pursuant to the Settlement Agreement, Anthony Page agreed to pay a \$2004.00 civil penalty, receive a public reprimand, and waive any right to appeal. The Commission concluded the matter by issuing an Agreed Final Order.
