FRANKFORT, KY – At its September 19<sup>th</sup>, 2024, meeting the Executive Branch Ethics Commission found Jeremy Boyle of Stanford, Kentucky, in violation of KRS Chapter 11A, the Executive Branch Code of Ethics.

In a Settlement Agreement approved by the Commission, Jeremy Boyle admitted to five (5) counts of violating the Executive Branch Code of Ethics. Specifically, while employed as an Engineering Supervisor for District Seven of the Transportation Cabinet, Jeremy Boyle used a state vehicle to attend to personal business while claiming state time. He also allowed others to use the state dumpster for non-state dumping.

Pursuant to the Settlement Agreement, Jeremy Boyle agreed to pay a \$10,000.00 civil penalty. He also agreed to a public reprimand and waived any right to appeal. The Commission concluded the matter by issuing an Agreed Final Order.
