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FRANKFORT, KY – At its July 16, 2025 meeting, the Executive Branch Ethics Commission (“the Commission”) found Daniel C. Jean-Louis of Frankfort, Kentucky, in violation of KRS Chapter 11A, the Executive Branch Code of Ethics.

In a Settlement Agreement, approved by the Commission, Daniel C. Jean-Louis admitted to one (1) count of violating the Code of Ethics, KRS 11A.020(1)(a) and (d). Specifically, between March 1, 2024 and June 30, 2024, while employed as an Administrative Specialist Senior, Cabinet for Health and Family Services, Daniel C. Jean-Louis falsely claimed to be working a total of 439.75 hours when he was not in fact working, resulting in an overpayment from the state. These acts resulted in a substantial conflict between his personal and private interest and his duties in the public interest, and he used his position to create privileges for himself in derogation of the public interest at large.

Pursuant to the Settlement Agreement, Daniel C. Jean-Louis agreed to pay a \$3,000.00 civil penalty, receive a public reprimand, and waive any right to appeal. The Commission concluded the matter by issuing an Agreed Final Order.
